Contractor/Developer/Trained Individual/Qualified Inspector Required Training

March 4, 2010

9:00am – 1:00pm

Under the NYS Department of Environmental Conservation's Stormwater Permit GP-0-08-001, all developers, contractors and subcontractors must identify at least one *trained individual* from their company that will be responsible for implementation of the Storm Water Pollution Prevention Plans ("SWPPPs"), and have at least one *trained individual* on site on a daily basis when soil disturbance activities are being performed. Also, developers must have a *qualified inspector* conduct regular site inspections in accordance with GP-0-08-001.

Qualified inspectors* and *trained individuals* must have 4 hours of training in the principles and practices of erosion and sediment control endorsed by NYS DEC, SWCD, or CPESC Inc. Training is good for 3 years. Training is **not required for CPESC, LA, and PE certified persons.
